# Cabinet Approves Government Communications Policy to Strengthen Strategic Messaging

Following a multi-stage formulation process, Uganda's National Communication Policy, 2026, was adopted by Cabinet on 9th March 2026, providing an overarching framework to guide communication across Ministries, Departments, Agencies, and Local Governments (MDA&LGs). The policy ensures that communication is systematically integrated into the Government of Uganda's development agenda, strengthening how public institutions inform, engage, and respond to citizens.

While emphasizing the importance of effective government communication during the Cabinet meeting that adopted the policy, His Excellency the President of Uganda, Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, called for greater clarity, convergence, and coherence in government messaging. He noted that coordinated communication is essential to ensure that citizens clearly understand government programs, policies, and national development initiatives.

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# Uganda Assumes Leadership of the Pan-African Postal Union Conference

Uganda has taken on a new continental role, assuming the chairmanship of the Pan African Postal Union (PAPU) Plenipotentiary Conference for the 2026–2030 cycle.

The position will be held by the Minister of ICT and National Guidance, Hon. Dr. Chris Baryomunsi. At the 11th Ordinary Session of the Conference, he was represented by Hon. Nyombi Thembo, Executive Director of the Uganda Communications Commission (UCC).

Uganda takes over from Zimbabwe, which has led the Conference for the past four years under Hon. Tatenda A. Mavetera, Minister of ICT, Postal and Courier Services of Zimbabwe. The Union acknowledged Zimbabwe's leadership and contribution during this period.

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## Kampala Hosts 44th PAPU Administrative Council to Advance Africa's Postal Transformation

Leaders from across Africa convened in Kampala for the 44th Ordinary Session of the Administrative Council of the Pan-African Postal Union, a key platform shaping the future of the continent's postal sector. The session brings together Ministers, regulators, and industry leaders to guide the transformation of the postal sector to drive trade, logistics, and digital connectivity.

Opening the session, the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, Dr. Aminah Zawedde, welcomed delegates to Uganda and expressed pride in hosting Africa's postal leadership at a time of significant change in the sector. She highlighted the critical role of the Administrative Council in guiding PAPU's work between Plenipotentiary Conferences, ensuring coordination, continuity, and strategic direction.

Among those attending the Council opening were the Deputy Director General of the Universal Postal Union, Osvald Marjan, PAPU Secretary General Dr. Sifundo Chief Moyo, Assistant Secretary General Jessica Hope Ssengooba, Executive Director of the Uganda Communications Commission Hon. Nyombi Thembo, and Chief Executives of postal operators and regulatory agencies from across Africa.

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## Alan Kasujja Assumes Office as Executive Director of the Uganda Media Centre

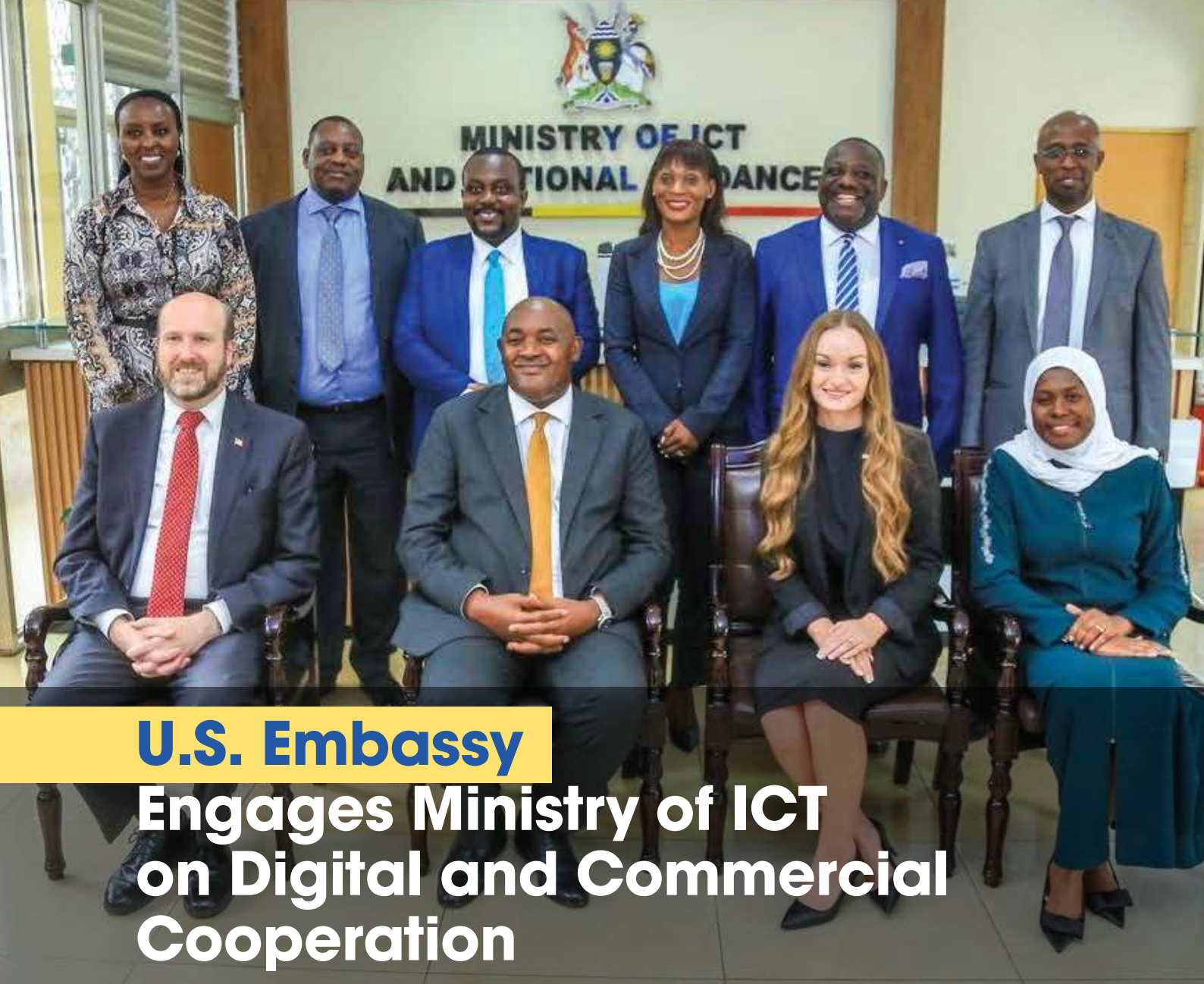
A new phase in Government communication has begun with the appointment of Mr Alan Kasujja as Executive Director of the Uganda Media Centre, marking a renewed focus on coordination, clarity, and public engagement in how Government communicates its priorities and programmes.

Speaking at the handover ceremony, the Minister for ICT and National Guidance, Hon. Dr. Chris Baryomunsi, noted that the communication landscape has evolved significantly, requiring a more coordinated and strategic approach.

He highlighted the recent approval of the Government Communication Policy, which will strengthen public relations and improve coordination and harmonisation of Government messaging across Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs), local governments, and Uganda's missions abroad. He also congratulated Mr. Kasujja on his appointment and recognised the contribution of former Executive Director Ofwono Opondo, commending his service and congratulating him on his election to Parliament.

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## U.S. Embassy

# Engages Ministry of ICT on Digital and Commercial Cooperation

On 25<sup>th</sup> February 2026, the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance hosted a delegation from the U.S. Embassy in Uganda, led by the U.S. Ambassador to Uganda, William Popp, marking an important step in strengthening digital and commercial cooperation between Uganda and the United States. The delegation also included Sarah Troutman, U.S. Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for the Bureau of African Affairs.

The Ugandan delegation was led by the Minister of ICT and National Guidance, Hon. Dr Chris Baryomunsi, together with the Permanent Secretary, Dr Aminah Zawedde. Heads of agencies under the Ministry were also in attendance, highlighting a

coordinated, whole-of-sector approach to advancing Uganda's digital transformation agenda.

Engaging alongside other sector agencies, the meeting explored high-impact areas of collaboration to accelerate Uganda's digital transformation. Discussions were comprehensive, focusing on technology investment, expansion of last-mile internet connectivity, IT skills attachment programmes with leading U.S. firms, artificial intelligence collaboration, and the need to strengthen regulatory and data protection frameworks to support sustainable digital growth.

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## Uganda Media Centre Receives 25 Laptops to Strengthen Government Communication

The Uganda Media Centre received 25 laptops from the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, delivered through the National Information Technology Authority-Uganda (NITA-U), to strengthen its capacity to coordinate and disseminate government information.

The laptops were handed over on 26th March, 2026, at the Media Centre in Kampala, in a ceremony officiated by the State Minister for National Guidance, Hon. Godfrey Baluku Kabbyanga.

Speaking at the event, the Minister said the government is positioning the Media Centre as a hub for official information, both in person and online. “We want the Media Centre to be the

primary source of government information. This support is part of a broader effort to ensure that accurate, timely information reaches the public and supports national development,” he said.

Uganda Media Centre Executive Director, Alan Kasujja, said the support comes at a critical time as the government intensifies efforts to improve communication, enhance public awareness, and ensure citizens are well informed about national programmes and opportunities.

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## ICT Ministry Delivers Computers to Strengthen Digital Education

The Government of Uganda, through the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, has provided 75 modern computers to key learning institutions to strengthen digital learning and expand access to technology in education. The support, delivered to Nkumba University, Gayaza Junior School, and St Thereza Mayirye Primary School in Mityana, is part of a broader effort to equip learners with practical digital skills, enhance teaching and research, and connect institutions to global knowledge platforms and opportunities.

The handover at Nkumba University and Gayaza Junior School was officiated by the State Minister for ICT and National Guidance, Hon. Joyce Nabposa Ssebugwawo. The exercise

commenced on March 4, 2026, at Nkumba University, where 30 computers were installed at the Wavah ICT Complex to support digital learning and innovation. In her remarks, the Minister noted that the donation fulfils the Government's commitment to ensure that no Ugandan is left behind in the digital era, emphasising that access to digital tools is now essential across all fields of study. She added that such investments will connect students to global knowledge, online learning platforms, and opportunities for innovation.

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## MoICT&NG-STI Alignment for Uganda's Digital Transformation

Uganda's ambition to transition from a predominantly peasant society to a modern, prosperous, upper-middle-income country is clearly articulated in Uganda Vision 2040. Central to this is the integration of the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance with Science, Technology, and Innovation (STI), a partnership essential for accelerating socio-economic transformation, industrialisation, and the growth of a knowledge-based economy.

On 17<sup>th</sup> March 2026, the Ministry and the STI Secretariat held their first collaboration workshop at the National ICT Innovation Hub. The session brought together leadership and technical teams to map existing efforts, align priorities, and prepare for the soft

launch of the IoT Lab, a key milestone reflecting this convergence.

Dr Aminah Zawedde, Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, emphasised that collaboration is critical to avoid duplication, inefficiency, and delays. She highlighted the Ministry's role in advancing digital infrastructure, innovation ecosystems, and citizen engagement, with initiatives like the National ICT Innovation Hub supporting startups, skills development, and local solutions.

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## Uganda-China Partnership to Benefit 50,000 Ugandans

At least 50,000 Ugandan youths are set to benefit from a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed by the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, the United Nations Health Industry Foundation (UNHIF), based in Hangzhou, China, and the Prince Kimbugwe Foundation.

Speaking at the signing of the MOU at the Ministry's Offices, Dr. Aminah Zawedde, the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, stated that the MOU's signing speaks to the ambitious strategies of Government like the 10-point growth strategy and the National Development Plan IV

which among others aims at expanding the country's economy from \$50 Billion to \$500 Billion by 2040.

"All intentions and achievements that we shall realise when implementing this MOU are anchored in our visions and National Development Plans," she said. "Therefore, this is not just a partnership between institutions but a partnership for people, progress and prosperity both on the side of Ugandans and the Chinese Government," she added.

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# National ICT Innovation Hub Partners with Lwera Electronics to Scale Youth STEM Mentorship



In January 2026, the National ICT Innovation Hub partnered with Lwera Electronics to strengthen youth STEM mentorship through practical, hands-on learning. The collaboration is designed to expose young learners to real-world technology development by providing access to essential electronics hardware, as well as mentorship from innovators within the Hub.

Through this partnership, students gain valuable hands-on experience in robotics and electronics, equipping them with early digital skills and practical knowledge. The initiative not only enhances learning but also inspires the next generation of innovators who will play a key role in advancing Uganda's digital transformation agenda.

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# Ministry Engages Stakeholders on Uganda's National AI & Emerging Technologies Strategy



Uganda's National AI & Emerging Technologies Strategy is taking shape through an inclusive, nationwide stakeholder engagement process led by the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance. The ongoing consultations are designed to ensure the strategy reflects the country's priorities, opportunities, and sector realities, while positioning emerging technologies as drivers of digital transformation and economic growth.

Stakeholders from government, academia, the private sector, and the wider innovation ecosystem have

convened to help develop the strategy, which will guide the adoption and governance of rapidly evolving digital technologies in Uganda. The engagements, organised in partnership with the National Information Technology Authority-Uganda (NITA-U) and AI Uganda, have brought together participants from sectors including agriculture, health, finance, education, tourism, manufacturing, and research.

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## ICT Industry Growth Highlighted at UJ-Connect Sixth JCC

For three years, the Uganda ICT Industry Promotion Project, UJ-Connect, has steadily reshaped Uganda's ICT sector, transforming an ambitious vision into measurable impact. Launched in 2023 by the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance in partnership with JICA, the project aims to strengthen Uganda's digital workforce, connect local enterprises to global markets, and foster a competitive technology ecosystem.

On 19th February 2026, stakeholders gathered at the National ICT Innovation Hub in Nakawa for the Sixth Joint Coordination Committee (JCC) meeting, reflecting on the progress achieved over the past three years and charting the next steps to sustain momentum. Since the formal launch of the Uganda-Japan ICT industry promotion partnership, that vision has steadily evolved from concept into structured implementation, with tangible results across skills development, policy frameworks, business linkages, and technology-driven entrepreneurship.

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# Uganda Strengthens Digital Transformation Through Strategic ICT Partnership

The Ministry of ICT and National Guidance formalised a partnership with Spotlight on Africa and Algorithmic Partners through a Memorandum of Understanding, marking a practical next step in Uganda’s digital transformation agenda.

At the centre of the agreement is the establishment of an ICT Innovation Hub in Mbale. The hub builds on Spotlight on Africa’s long-standing presence in the region, including its women’s and paediatric hospitals, and is designed to equip young people with market-relevant digital skills while supporting community-driven innovation and entrepreneurship.

Speaking at the signing, Dr. Aminah Zawedde, Permanent Secretary at the Ministry, emphasised the shift from intent to execution. She noted that the partnership reflects the role of private sector leadership in advancing digital transformation, strengthening regional growth, expanding ICT skills, and supporting women’s empowerment, all with a clear focus on delivery and results.

# Equips Local Gov't Communicators with Laptops

The Ministry of ICT and National Guidance handed over laptops to 176 District Communication Officers to enhance government information dissemination and strengthen strategic communication at the local government level.

The handover ceremony took place at the Imperial Royale Hotel, Kampala, and was presided over by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, Dr. Aminah Zawedde.

The initiative is part of Government's ongoing efforts to empower communication officers across districts, municipalities, and cities with digital tools necessary to effectively communicate government policies, programmes, and projects within the communities they serve.

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# Government Strengthens Strategic Communication to Protect Uganda's Image, Exports, and Investment



The Government has reaffirmed its commitment to coordinated strategic communication as a driver of economic growth, export competitiveness, tourism development, and Uganda's international reputation.

This was emphasised during a meeting of the National Strategic Communications Committee (NSCC), a high-level inter-agency coordination platform established under Presidential directives to centralise government communication and support exports, tourism, and investment. The meeting, convened at Sheraton Kampala on 17th February 2026, brought together representatives from key government institutions, the private sector, and

the media to assess progress and align priorities.

Speaking at the engagement, the Minister of ICT and National Guidance, Hon. Dr Chris Baryomusi, said the government strongly upholds freedom of expression and open national discourse. He stressed, however, that this freedom must be exercised responsibly, noting that today's communication directly impacts investor confidence, social cohesion, and Uganda's global standing. He mentioned that inaccurate or inconsistent messaging can undermine exports, tourism, and broader national development, underscoring the importance of coherence and accuracy.

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# Beyond the Ballot: Mitooma Leaders Called to Shift Focus from Politics to Progress

In a vibrant two-day workshop held at the Mitooma Town Council on 29th and 30th January 2026, the conversation shifted from the heat of recent elections to the practical work of building a nation. Organized by the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, the gathering brought together a wide array of voices, from seasoned ministers to newly elected local councillors, all centered on the idea of what it truly means to lead.

The State Minister for ICT and National Guidance, Hon. Godfrey Baluku Kabyanga, set a serious tone for the event by challenging the newly elected leaders

to be the gold standard for their communities. He was firm in his stance that leadership is not a trophy to be displayed, but a responsibility to be lived out. He specifically pointed to government initiatives like the Parish Development Model and Emyooga, noting that these programs only succeed when local leaders take a personal interest in ensuring they actually reach the people they are meant to help. His message was simple: put the livelihoods of the citizens above personal gain and focus on the national interest.

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## Parliamentary ICT Committee Advocates for Greater Investment in Local ICT Startups

As Uganda continues to advance its digital transformation agenda, government leaders are placing increasing emphasis on locally developed digital solutions to strengthen service delivery and economic growth. In line with this national priority led by the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, the Parliamentary Committee on ICT and National Guidance conducted an oversight and verification visit to the Uganda Institute of Information and Communications Technology on 29th January 2026, led by Tonny Ayoo.

During the visit, UICT leadership showcased the Institute's ongoing efforts to nurture digital talent and develop practical technology solutions to national challenges. The engagement provided Members of Parliament with an opportunity to interact directly with

students, innovators, and trainers while assessing the infrastructure and programmes supporting start-ups and digital skills development.

One of the highlights of the visit was a live Augmented Virtual Reality (AVR) demonstration conducted by the Institute. The session simultaneously trained TVET instructors at Ntinda Vocational Training Institute, farmers in Mayuge District, and secondary school teachers, illustrating how AVR technology can deliver immersive and practical training across different locations. This approach enables UICT to standardize training quality across institutions while scaling skills development without a proportional increase in cost.

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# Ministry of ICT and National Guidance Strengthens Staff Financial Literacy Through NSSF Partnership

The Ministry of ICT and National Guidance strengthened its staff's financial literacy and long-term financial planning capacity through a three-day workshop on financial literacy and wealth creation, conducted in partnership with the National Social Security Fund (NSSF).

Held from 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> February 2026 at the Ministry headquarters, the training was part of the Ministry's broader commitment to staff welfare, capacity building, and sustainable livelihoods beyond active service. The workshop equipped staff with practical knowledge on saving, investment, retirement planning, and responsible financial management.

Opening the training, the Permanent Secretary, Dr Aminah Zawedde, emphasised the importance of financial discipline among public servants, noting that personal financial stability contributes directly to productivity and improved service delivery.

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# Iftar Dinner Highlights Faith, Unity, and National Service

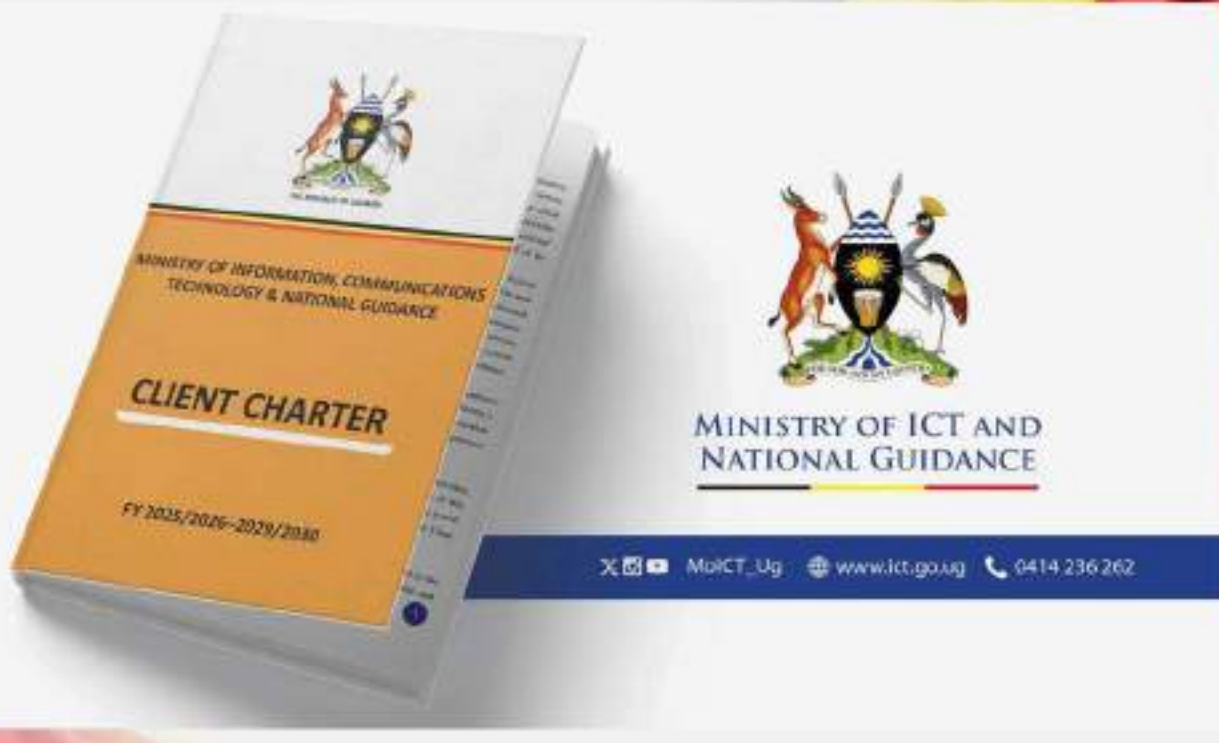
The Ministry of ICT and National Guidance hosted a special Iftar dinner on Tuesday, 10th March 2026, bringing together colleagues from government ministries, departments, and agencies, as well as staff and guests, to mark the spiritual significance of the holy month of Ramadan. The event provided a platform for reflection on faith, national unity, and the shared commitment to service.

Welcoming the gathering, Hon. Dr Chris Baryomunsi, Minister of ICT and National Guidance, highlighted the importance of diversity and unity in Uganda. He noted that while citizens may differ in ethnicity, region, or faith, “we are all Ugandans. Some common values and interests bind us together, and this dinner is a reminder that unity and mutual respect are essential for national development.”

The Minister reflected on the historical roots of the Abrahamic faiths, emphasizing shared principles between Christianity, Islam, and Judaism. “Even in faith, there is commonality. Fasting, compassion, and reflection are shared practices. There is no reason for people of different faiths to be enemies. We must work for peace, love, and unity to ensure a better quality of life for all Ugandans.”

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## The Client Charter and What it Changes for Digital Services in Uganda

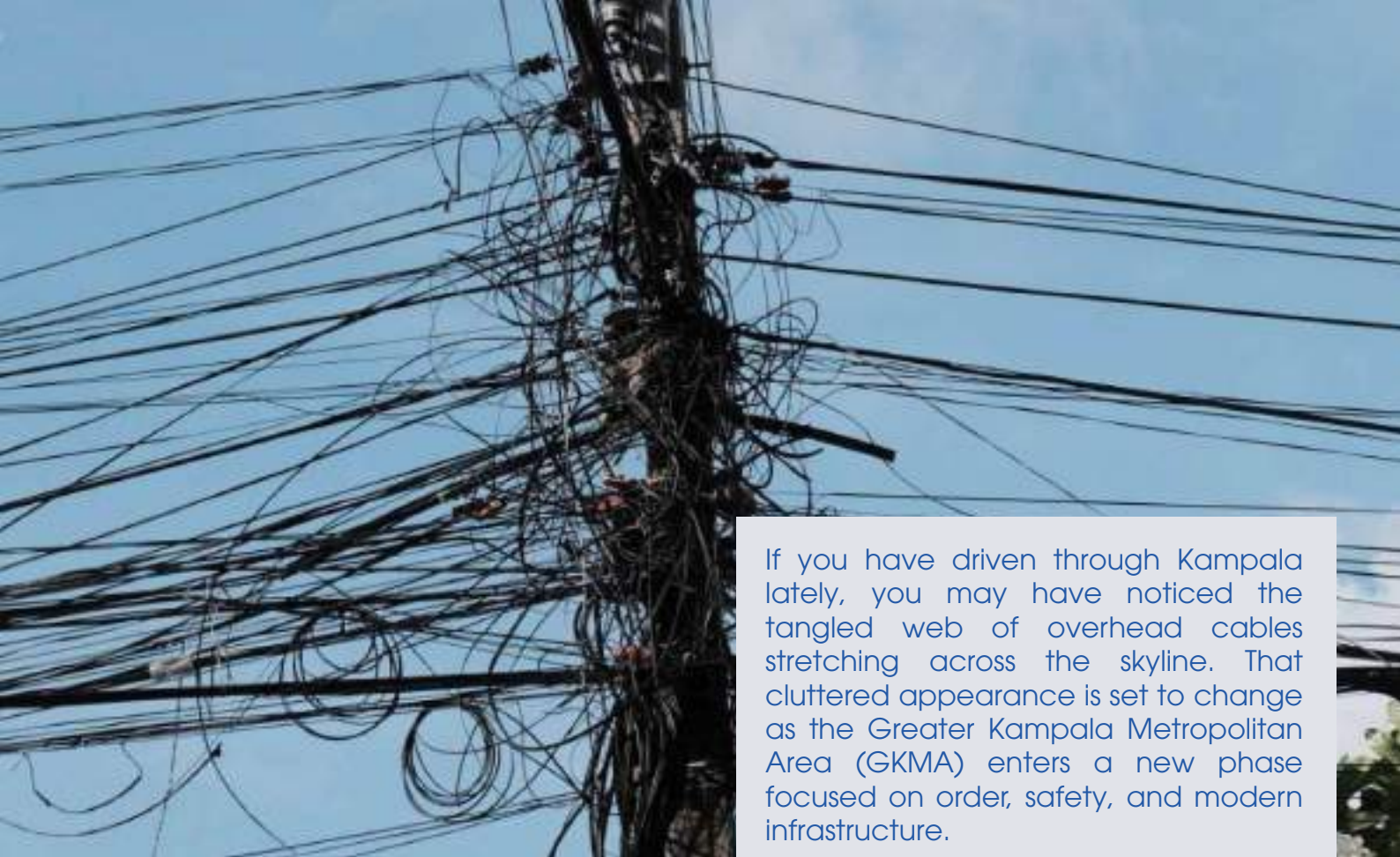
For many Ugandans, government services are judged on a simple scale. How long does it take? Whether someone responds. Whether the system works when you need it. With the launch of its new Client Service Charter for the period 2025/26 to 2029/30, the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance is putting those everyday experiences at the centre of how it measures success.

The Charter is the Ministry's public promise to citizens. It sets clear expectations for the services people should receive, how long those services should take, and how the government will be held accountable when they fall short. More importantly, it signals a shift from plans and intentions to visible, measurable, tangible results.

Speaking at the launch, the Permanent Secretary, Dr Aminah Zawedde, was clear about what this change means in practice. She noted that Uganda has made significant investments in digital infrastructure over the years, but citizens now expect those investments to translate into faster, simpler, and more reliable services.

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# Transforming Digital Infrastructure in the Greater Kampala Metropolitan Area

If you have driven through Kampala lately, you may have noticed the tangled web of overhead cables stretching across the skyline. That cluttered appearance is set to change as the Greater Kampala Metropolitan Area (GKMA) enters a new phase focused on order, safety, and modern infrastructure.

On 11th April 2025, the Head of Public Service and Secretary to the Cabinet issued a strategic directive to launch a comprehensive reorganization of utility infrastructure across the metropolitan area. The objective is clear: improve the city's visual appeal while organizing connectivity systems more efficiently. This involves removing redundant utility poles and relocating overhead fiber cables into structured, shared systems that utilize underground service ducts along KCCA roads.

Following the directive, a feasibility field visit was conducted from 11th to 13th August 2025 to assess technical, operational, and logistical requirements on the ground. The team evaluated the extent of pole congestion, the condition of existing infrastructure, and the priority interventions. Building on these insights, the first all-stakeholders meeting was held on 20th August 2025, bringing together key actors to align on findings, clarify roles, and finalize an implementation roadmap.

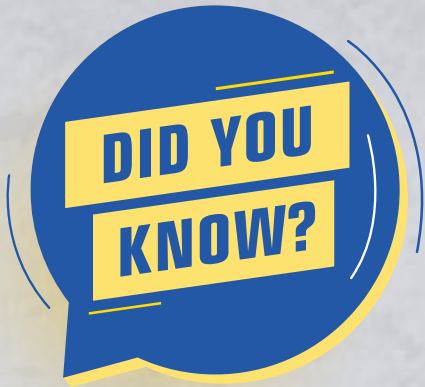

Her milestone also shows the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance's commitment to

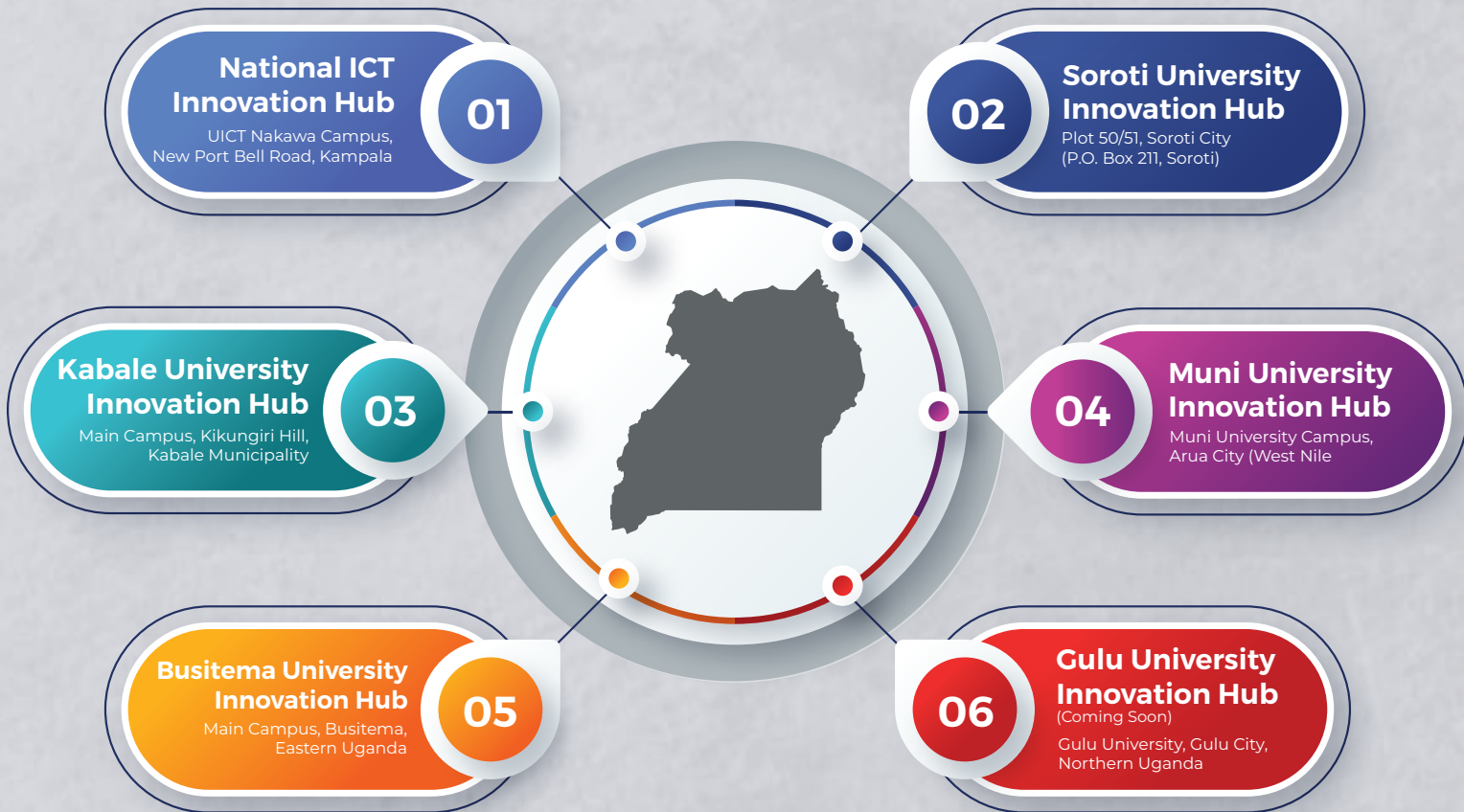

Doreen's achievement is a testament to the importance of professionalism in engineering and its role in advancing inclusive, resilient digital development in Uganda.



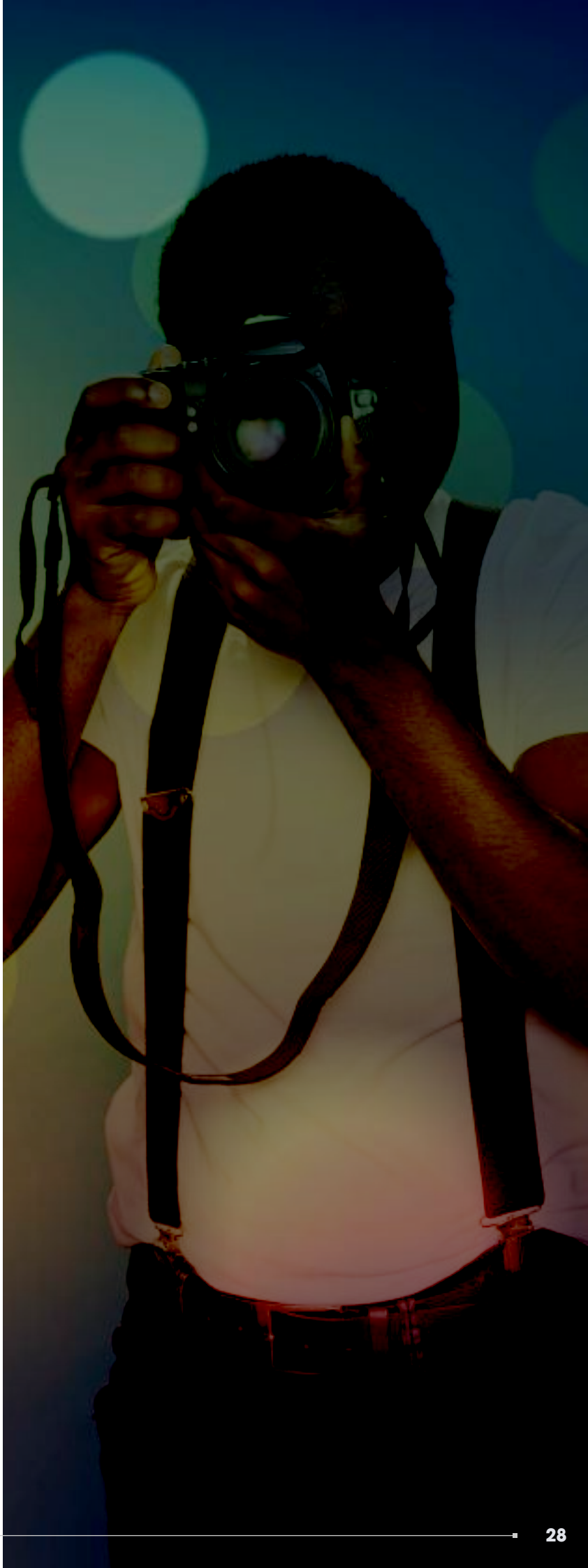
